Global Village Foundation *in a glance*

Global Village Foundation (GVF) is a charitable organization, founded in 1999 by author and humanitarian Le Ly Hayslip. It has a charitable registration in the United States (501-c3) and is registered with the Vietnamese government as non-profit, non-religion and non-political organization. GVF focuses on providing humanitarian aid, promoting cultural awareness, education and sustainable community development projects all over rural Vietnam. GVF is based in Ho Chi Minh City, and works directly with the rural communities of Quang Nam Province and Mekong Delta.

During the last 10 years, the Global Village Foundation has funded and constructed many new houses for the poor, built and equipped kindergartens, primary schools, village market, libraries, cultural and vocational training centers, renovated and set up an income center for the blind, provided annual emergencies relief as well as micro credit loans for social enterprises. Current main projects of GVF include a Portable Mobile Library Project, Blind Massage Center Projects, a Dental and Public Healthcare Education Project, many Rural Infrastructure Development Projects, Emergency Relief Programs and Poverty Reducing Projects.





GVF strives to empower economically marginalized rural community members with knowledge through literacy development and health education programs, so that these groups will be able to achieve income sufficiency, thereby having the opportunity to participate in greater equity in Vietnam's socioeconomic development goals. Through the hard work of our dedicated staff and volunteers, we seek to break generational cycles of rural poverty, illiteracy, and hopelessness.

In ten years, GVF grew from a little seedling, blossomed into a beautiful flower and finally flourished into a huge tree. Consistent with our vision, we aspire to become a leading organization in improving education and reducing poverty for the disadvantaged people of Vietnam, just like a big tree which provides shelter for the needy, regardless of rain or shine. Through this book, we will walk you through our growing process and together rediscover our ten years of marvellous and fruitful journey!

About our founder Le Ly Hayslip

Global Village Foundation (GVF) was founded and led by internationally well-known author, philanthropist, peace activist and speaker, Ms. Le Ly (pronounced as 'lay lee') Hayslip (also known as Phung Thi Le Ly).

She was born in the south Danang in Vietnam in 1950, experienced all the horrors and tragedies of war before immigrating to the USA in 1970. In 1986, Le Ly returned to Vietnam after sixteen years of absence and was stunned by the devastation, poverty and illness left by the U.S.-Vietnam war. Determined to make a difference, she wrote two books about her life.

The first book '*When Heaven and Earth Changed Places*' was released in 1989. In 1993, the second book '*Child of War, Woman of Peace*' was published.

Over 25 years (1986 ~ 2011), Le Ly has been working tirelessly to become a bridge builder of peace, providing much needed aid to her homeland and helping open the dialogue between the U.S. and Vietnam. In 1993, Le Ly's two successful autobiographical books were immortalized in Oliver Stone's movie about Vietnam, 'Heaven and Earth'. Le Ly's commitment to rebuild her motherland had escalated with Stone's assistance. Le Ly built her first organization East Meets West in 1987 and that is currently one of the largest non-governmental organization in Vietnam; after accomplishing the missions at her first foundation, she left in 1998 and started Global Village Foundation in 1999 to focus on health and educational challenges, the promotion of peace internationally and the empowerment of women and children across all of Asia.

As the Founder and President of GVF, Le Ly remains actively involved in all aspects of GVF's work. She has to juggle among her international speaking obligations, board responsibilities and writing commitments. Despite the inherent difficulties, Le Ly and her foundations have received many awards and recognition from all over the world. In 2009, Le Ly received the highest honour ever given by the Vietnamese government to a foreigner - the Medal Award which recognizes Le Ly's enormous contribution to her country of birth over the past 25 years.

President's Message

Dear Friends,

Here I am, writing this message to you, in the peaceful village of Da Phuc, Vietnam.

This beautiful country has been plagued by wars, famine, drought, flood and other disasters for centuries. I wouldn't have known how meaningful my life would be, if I had not answered life's calling to serve my motherland 25 years ago. For the past ten years with Global Village Foundation, I have witnessed how the hard work of our volunteers and us had significantly impacted the daily lives of Vietnamese people. That is why nothing has stopped me in bringing international volunteers back, especially Americans who fought in the US-Vietnam war.



I still remember the historical moment back in 1987, when I first brought American volunteers to Vietnam, and when thousands witnessed the opening of 'Mother Love Clinic' in my birth village, funded by war veteran and film director, Oliver Stone. It signified the start of a long journey of peace and goodwill between Vietnam and the United States. From a ban on American travelers in 1989 to receiving 200,000 American tourists in 2010, Vietnam has opened its door and has seen tremendous improvement in its economy. Although the living standards improved in big cities, many Vietnamese still live below the poverty line in rural areas. Here in Ben Tre, the average household income is between \$150 and \$300 per year. The minorities who live in the mountainous region have an even harder life. Thanks to international donors and volunteers, the poor people could receive assistance in terms of money and supplies to help them pass the most difficult times.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of Global Village Foundation and we launch this book to commemorate our 10-year journey and express our deep-felt appreciation to all our philanthropists, volunteers, staff and all those who have supported us in one way or another. Most of all, we hope this book will help you find your purpose in life and we would like you to join us to help the poor in all our projects.

Mobile Library Project

Objective To provide books and to inculcate a love for reading in rural children

Summary A mobile library is a wooden box containing 200 to 250 books, which are specially selected to suit the needs of different age groups. There are a mixture of Vietnamese and English books which vary in difficulty levels. Each school has four such boxes. They are rotated at the end of each semester among different schools to allow for an exchange of books. GVF also conducts mobile library training workshops to train teachers, librarians and parents on how to use the library more effectively. Rural children who yearn for knowledge can now enjoy reading as urban children do.

The project is first initiated by GVF in year 2006, with the support from the Ministry of Education and Training in Danang and the International Fund. In year 2010, HSBC Vietnam and Bao Viet Holdings Insurance Corporation became the official sponsors of mobile library project. Both companies will sponsor the project for three years starting from academic year 2010/2011.




2008 Nov: More mobile libraries were presented to Duy Phuoc, Le Do and other primary schools in An Bang – Hoi An area.



2008 Dec: With National University of Singapore volunteers, GVF renovated Van Quat kindergarten (Duy Xuyen – Quang Nam).



2008 Dec: The volunteers also gave 4 mobile libraries to the children at the kindergarten.



2010 Sep: With sponsorship from HSBC and Bao Viet Group, GVF organized a ceremony presenting mobile libraries to disadvantaged pupils from Da Nang primary schools .

2010 Dec: Supplied 75 schools with more than 20,000 new books and organized two training workshops in Da Nang, Quang Nam province and Hanoi.



2010 Dec: In addition, GVF gave one book box to the children of Quang Chau Pagoda Children Orphanage.



2011 May:: The Giellett family, from the US, visited Vietnam as volunteers with GVF for 2 weeks to teach English in Duy Vinh School near Hoi An, Quang Nam Province.



2011 May: In addition, the Giellett family also worked with special needs children at 2 disabled children centres in Danang City

When the Mobile Library book boxes are delivered to the schools, students are invariably excited and elated to receive so many books all at once. To us, they may just be more books among the many we have read, but to these children, these books hold great promises for their future.

RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

Objective To address the pressing housing development needs and to improve the living conditions of the rural inhabitants of flood-prone Quang Nam Province


Summary GVF's past and current projects include installing water filtration systems in rural schools, building homes for poverty-stricken families and victims of Agent Orange, constructing and refurbishing buildings for schools, libraries, community centers and medical clinics. GVF also helps in building playgrounds, as well as village markets and other infrastructure to help raise the standards of living throughout Quang Nam Province.

In recent years, GVF has focused its attention on housing projects for the poor. In 2009, GVF built twenty houses, of which nine houses were built in collaboration with students from NUS University Scholar's Programme (USP).



2000: Sponsored VND 750 million (USD 50,000) to build Ky La Traditional Vocational Training Center (Ngu Hanh Son – Da Nang).

Also sponsored the Hope Village Orphanage with total expenditure of VND 65 million (USD 4,334).



2001: Donated about VND 125 million to build a school in Tan Tra area with two rooms and sponsor lunch boxes for one year.


2002: Sponsored VND 42 million (2,718 USD) to renovate and upgrade Anh Dao kindergarten (Hai Chau – Da Nang).




2003: Contributed VND 153 million (USD 10,000) to build Binh Ky market (Ngu Hanh Son – Da Nang).

2003: Sponsored VND 86 million (USD 6,000) to build Que Chau kindergarten (Que Son – Quang Nam).

2004 Nov: Nguyen Phan Vinh primary school received VND 195 million (USD 12,745) to upgrade classrooms.



2005 Jul: The old house of Mrs. Pham Thi Kha, 66 years old, who built a house by herself after the war had ended. GVF raised VND 8 million (USD 516) with Globe Aware volunteers to build a new house for her to live the rest of her life.



2005 Sep: The old house of Mrs. Phan Thi Loi, her handicapped husband and three children in the mountain area of Dai Loc – Quang Nam.



2005 Sep: Once again, with Globe Aware volunteers, GVF built a new house with one living room, two bed rooms, and one toilet for her family.



2005 Sep: GVF staff and Mrs. Tran Thi Le's family in front of her old house.



2005 Sep: GVF built a new house for her family with total expenditure of VND 15 million (USD 1,000).



2005 Dec: Sponsored VND 75 million to build a kindergarten and playground in Que Son – Quang Nam.



2006 Dec: Another 21 volunteers from Singapore built a kindergarten, a kitchen, and a library.



2007 Jul: Four US volunteers came to rebuilt a house for Mr. Ha Van Tuyen's family with VND 12 million.

2007 Dec: Brought a group of volunteers from Singapore to sponsor VND 215 million and build a kindergarten, repair Nguyen Phan Vinh primary school and a playground.



2008 Mar: Restlessly continued sponsoring VND 15.5 million and bringing volunteers to build a new house for Mr. Vo Duc Thinh.



2009 Dec: For the first time, GVF and student volunteers from National University of Singapore introduced a Micro Credit Loan program to help 9 underprivileged families.



2010 Dec: Hosted 50 volunteers from National University of Singapore to Hiep Duc – Quang Nam to extend the Micro Credit Loan program.





2010 Dec: Despite the heavy rain, a group of 15 American students and their professors donated trees, planted bushes and built fences around a big school.





Community Library Project


Objective To provide rural communities with access to books for leisure and educational purposes.

Summary It was first initiated in 2008 by a group of students from Singapore. Currently, GVF has two community libraries under its care --- one in Duy Vinh village, the other one in Cam Kim village. The Duy Vinh Community Library is already functional for over a year. The Cam Kim Community Library is fully furnished but is still in shortage of books. The community library is managed by volunteer librarians and opens every day from late afternoon till evening. Despite various challenges, the project has helped villagers, both adults and children, in accessing reading materials after work or school. In Summer, there could be as many as forty visitors to the library per day.

2005 Aug: Collaborated with volunteers from Singapore and Grass Routes group from Canada to build a community library in Dong Binh village (Duy Xuyen – Quang Nam).



2010: With ITE (Singapore) volunteers renovated and furnished a second community library in Cam Kim – Hoi An.





Blind Massage Center Project

Objective To integrate the blind community in Danang city into the mainstream society through sustainable means of living.

Summary Currently, there are five and 13 massage centers in Danang city and in Quang Nam province (other than Danang city) respectively. It was a switch from the focus on producing brooms to the emphasis on providing massage services. While the brooms business initially created jobs and generated income for the blind, it was not a sustainable idea in terms of working environment, health conditions, social risk and sufficient earnings. Moreover, they were not trained necessary skills and Braille literacy which was a key component towards the educational development. Blind Massage Center project was therefore introduced to overcome the three main concerns: education, safety and sustainability.

Dental And Health Education Project

Objective To provide basic dental and medical care to the poor, give training and equipment to the local health care personnel, thus, improve the quality of life in rural Vietnam.

Summary The Dental Health and Education Project (DHEP) works with dentists, doctors, nurses, and medical corporations to provide professional dental and medical services, preventative health education, and equipment to the rural communities of Quang Nam Province. More recently in 2007 through 2009, GVF worked with partners at The Rotary Club of Osaka, The Rotary Club of Taipei, Dr. Hiramoto and The Rotary Club of Hiroshima, Mr. Masashi Hiraishi and his Rotary Club members.

Costs of dental services, age-appropriate educational materials are borne by dentists or dental clinics from the United States. Dental care supplies like toothpaste, brushes, floss, etc donated by American manufacturers and their Asian and European counterparts.

EMERGENCY RELIEF



Objective To help victims of flood, famine or other misfortunes survive the most difficult times, by providing emergency relief in terms of money, supplies and emotional support.

Summary GVF offer help to people who needed it most urgently. In 2010, 50 relief packages were distributed to 50 poor families living in the mountain, to help those families with children to spend their holidays without hunger. Most families were surviving on roots, wild plants and whatever they could hunt.

In 2009, GVF delivered emergency relief to several thousands of flood victims with over USD15,000 worth of supplies. Thanks to many kind souls in Santa Rosa, Florida who donated funds to Emergency Relief in October.

Under the leadership of Le Ly, GVF also helped in the Tsunami relief work in Sri Lanka and Thailand in 2005. When Quang Binh experienced one of the worst flood in years, GVF acted quickly to take care of the flood victims there.

In 2005, after deliberate discussion with the Board of Directors, Ms. Hayslip decided to bring the Bridge of Peace Awards back.



Peace Boat—Life on Board

Do not let Le Ly Hay's diminutive size fool you, as it fails to illustrate how much energy, compassion and dedication she actually holds. Since 1994 Le Ly has been coming aboard Peace Boat as a guest speaker, and on this voyage she was joined by her son Alan Haylop to talk about their non-profit work with orphanages and schools in Viet Nam and Sri Lanka. A peace activist, Le Ly's personal memoirs, which chronicle her painful and ultimately triumphant journey from a childhood in Cuver Stone to her new life in the US, were adapted into the film "Heaven and Earth" by Oliver Stone in 1994.



As an outspoken critic of war, Le Ly has been honored many times for her charitable service and humanitarian peace efforts. In 1986, Le Ly returned to Viet Nam to visit her aging mother and was struck by the devastation, poverty and illness left by the war. She organized the East Meets West Foundation, a non-profit organization which provides housing, education and medical care for Vietnamese children and villagers. After accompanying a US trade mission to Viet Nam with Bill and Hillary Clinton in 2000 to sign a historic final trade agreement between the US and Viet Nam, Le Ly expanded her vision to promote peace and harmony among all nations of the world by establishing a Global Village Foundation. Through its annual Bridge of Peace Awards event, the Foundation honors individuals and organizations for their humanitarian contributions and peace efforts. Past honorees have included Maya Ling Lin, Oliver Stone and Peace Boat. The foundation's grassroots efforts provide schools and orphanages to impoverished rural areas, such as the ones Peace Boat participants visited in Viet Nam as well as in a tsunami-devastated area of Sri Lanka.

Influenced by Mahatma Gandhi and Mother Teresa, Le Ly aspires to spread her message for peace by talking openly about war and its destruction at venues ranging from universities to the Peace Boat. She started in Iraq I immediately felt a connection to the people because they were going through what the Vietnamese people went through 30 years ago. I felt very sad for all humanity." Aware of possible misconceptions about the US people, Le Ly reached out to the Iraqi guests to learn how she could help reconstruct the country and heal the people of Iraq.

Le Ly believes we can build "bridges of peace" together as an alternative to war and violence by educating ourselves about past wars with open dialogue about past wounds. In this way we can learn from each other...
